- **Animal health & welfare integration** → Emphasis on better veterinary access and standards (e.g., disease prevention, zoonotic risks) ties pet care to compliance/ESG frameworks. Non-aligned choices could face indirect pressures via supply chains or regulations.
- **Digital traceability & ID systems** → Microchipping, health apps, and traceability laws (influenced by broader SDG/SDG 16 trends) extend to pet records → added surveillance burden, data sharing, and privacy erosion for pets and owners.
- **ESG & sustainability in pet industry** → Policies promoting responsible consumption/animal welfare in pet food/supplies could raise costs or limit options under compliance pressure.

## What Non Compliance Could Mean

- Increased vet/pet health data collection and tracking
- Higher costs or restricted access to care/supplies from sustainability mandates
- Long-term legacy hit: Pet/family data tied to global systems, reducing control
